



Coincident Economic Activity Index for Idaho








Weekly Wages in Eastern Idaho

- Butte county has the highest average wage at \$1,812



Labor Utilization in 2020


Chart 2. Numbers of selected underutilized workers in Idaho, annual averages






Hispanic/Latino Demographics in Madison County



The colored dots on this map depict streamflow conditions as a <u>percentile</u>, which is computed from the period of record for the current day of the year. Only stations with at least 30 years of record are used.

The **gray circles** indicate other stations that were not ranked in percentiles either because they have fewer than 30 years of record or because they report parameters other than streamflow. Some stations, for example, measure stage only.

Most of Idaho's stream flow is low or medium, being from less than the 10th percentile to a high of the 75th percentile.



Idaho in a Drought



D0 - Abnormally Dry

- · Irrigation demand is higher than normal
- Ski areas open later; visitation is lower; snowpack is lower

D1 - Moderate Drought

- Dryland hay and grain crop yields are low; other crops and pasture are in poor condition
- Well levels decline; reservoir levels are low; water shortages occur; water conservation programs are in place
- Fire risk is elevated; fires spread easily



D2 - Severe Drought

- Grazing season is shortened; vegetation is sparse; crops are left unharvested; feedlots are not profitable
- · River levels are very low
- Hydroelectric power is down; irrigation water allotments are significantly curtailed

D3 - Extreme Drought

- Dryland farms are left fallow; forage is limited; cattle herds are cut
- · Spring snowpack is very low
- · Number of fires increase

D4 - Exceptional Drought



- Fire danger is high
- Hydropower generation is affected; power companies may raise rates and/or purchase alternative power
- Trees are stressed and threatened by insect infestation; fish and wildlife populations decrease; habitats are degraded

All of Idaho has at least a moderate drought. Most of Idaho is in a severe drought and there are even areas that are in an exceptional drought.





Chart 1. Number of fatal occupational injuries by employee status, Idaho, 2010–19




The amount of fatal work injuries spiked in 2018.


Chart 2. Distribution of total fatal occupational injuries by event, United States and Idaho, 2019

Half of Idahoans are not originally from Idaho and the number of Native Idahoans is decreasing.





Precipitation in Boise, Idaho






Precipitation in Idaho seems to be highest in March.


Obesity rates increasing in Idaho as time goes on.


 Percentage of residents acquiring Bachelor's Degrees or higher has been increasing slowly over the past few years.

Unemployment in Eastern Idaho






- The counties of Teton, Fremont, and Butte typically have higher unemployment rates
- However in 2020 Bonneville and Teton counties had the biggest jumps in unemployment




Median Household Income in Eastern Idaho









Rain Graph for Rexburg, ID

















Net County-to-County Migration Flow






The current goods and services trade deficit is \$70.1 billion




