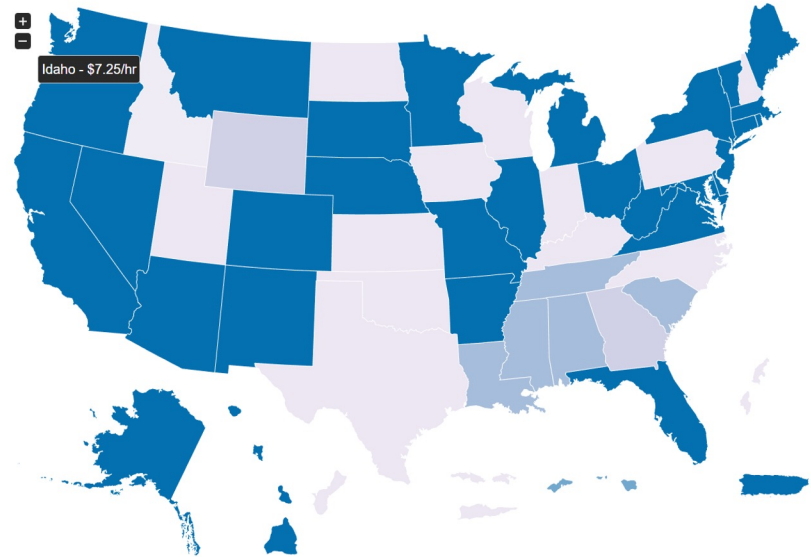

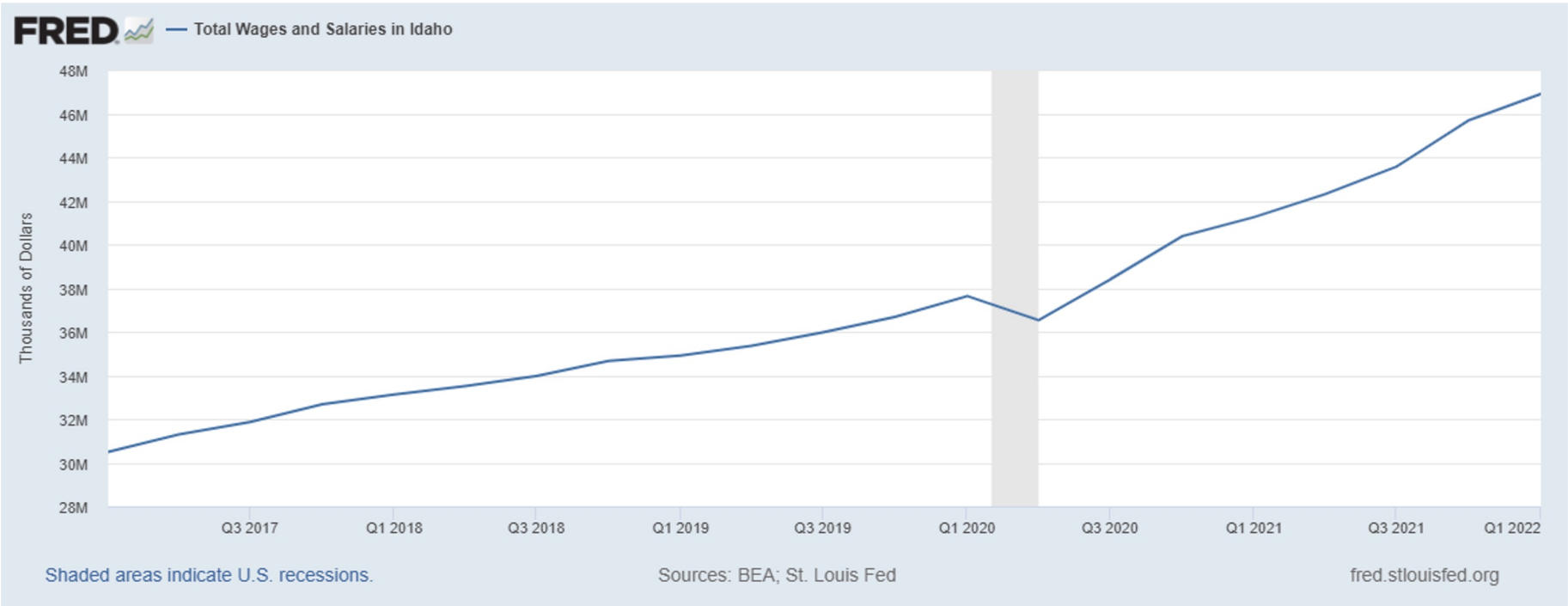

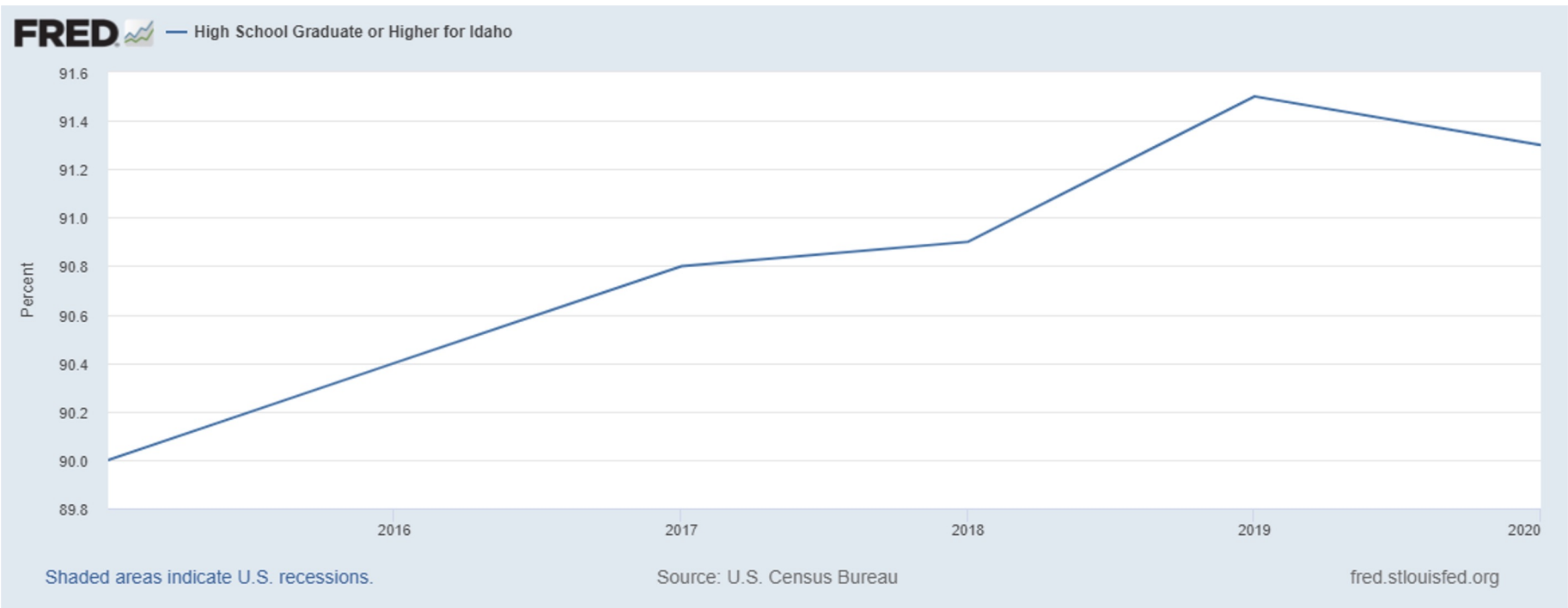

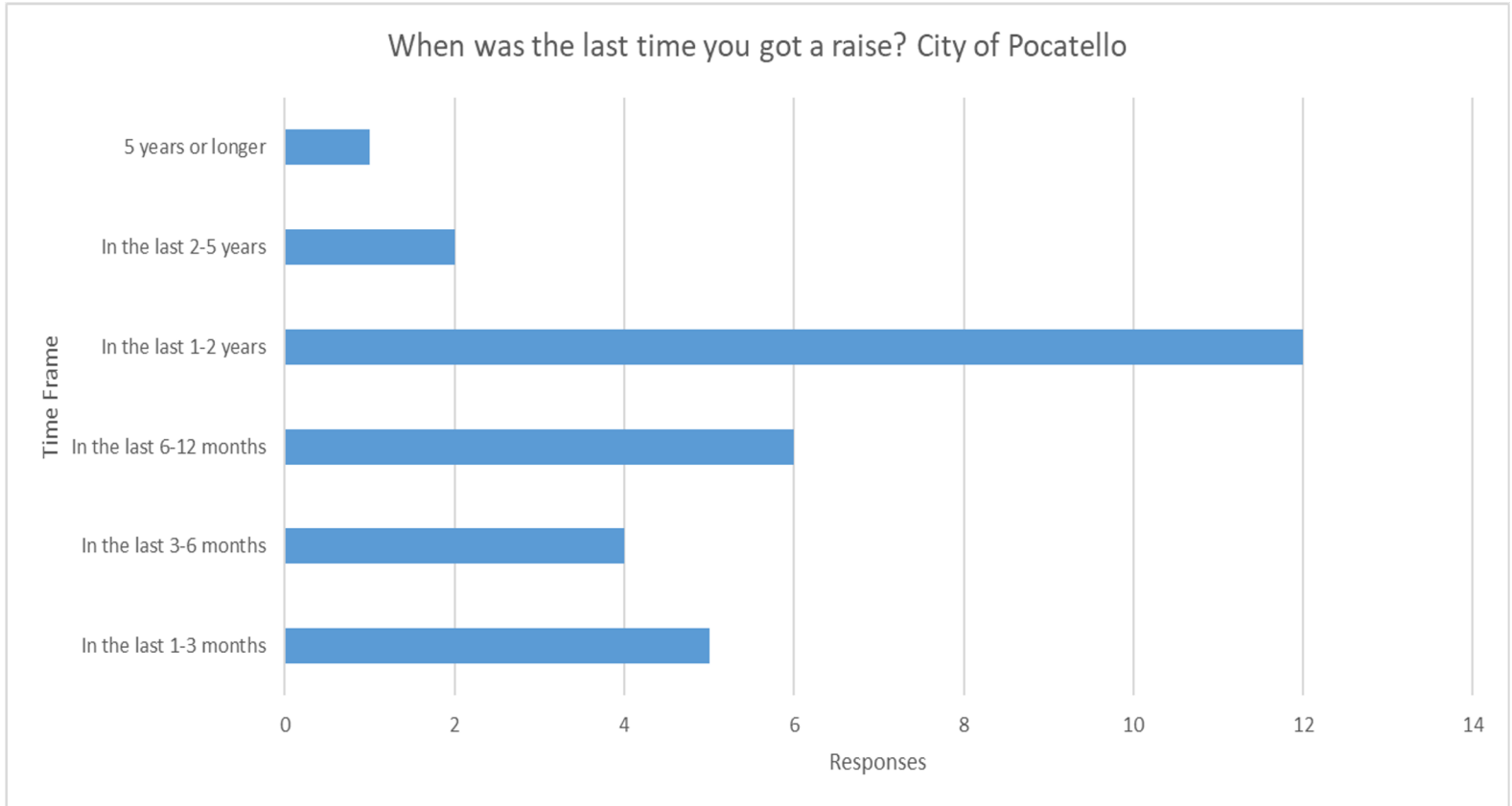


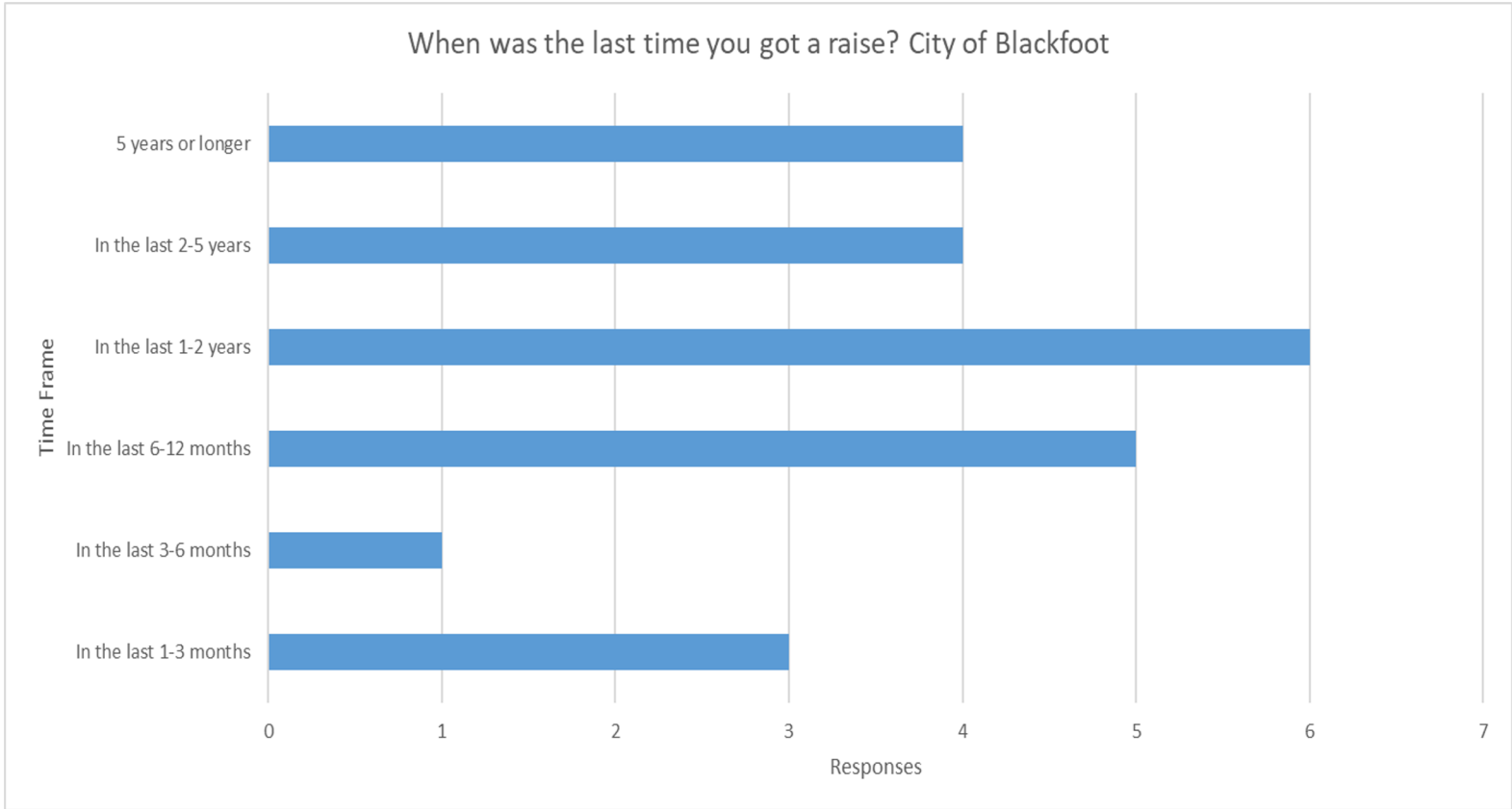


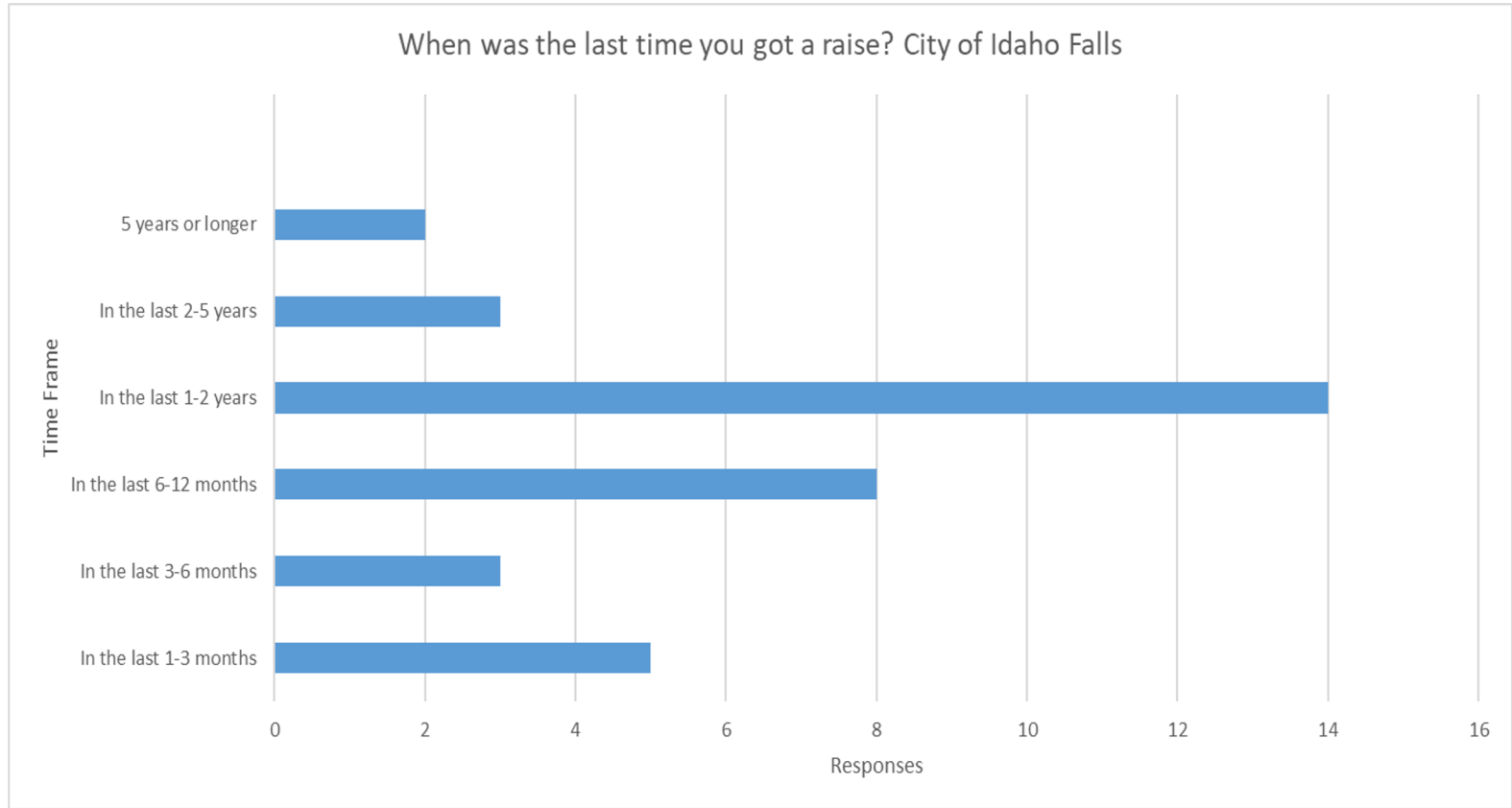


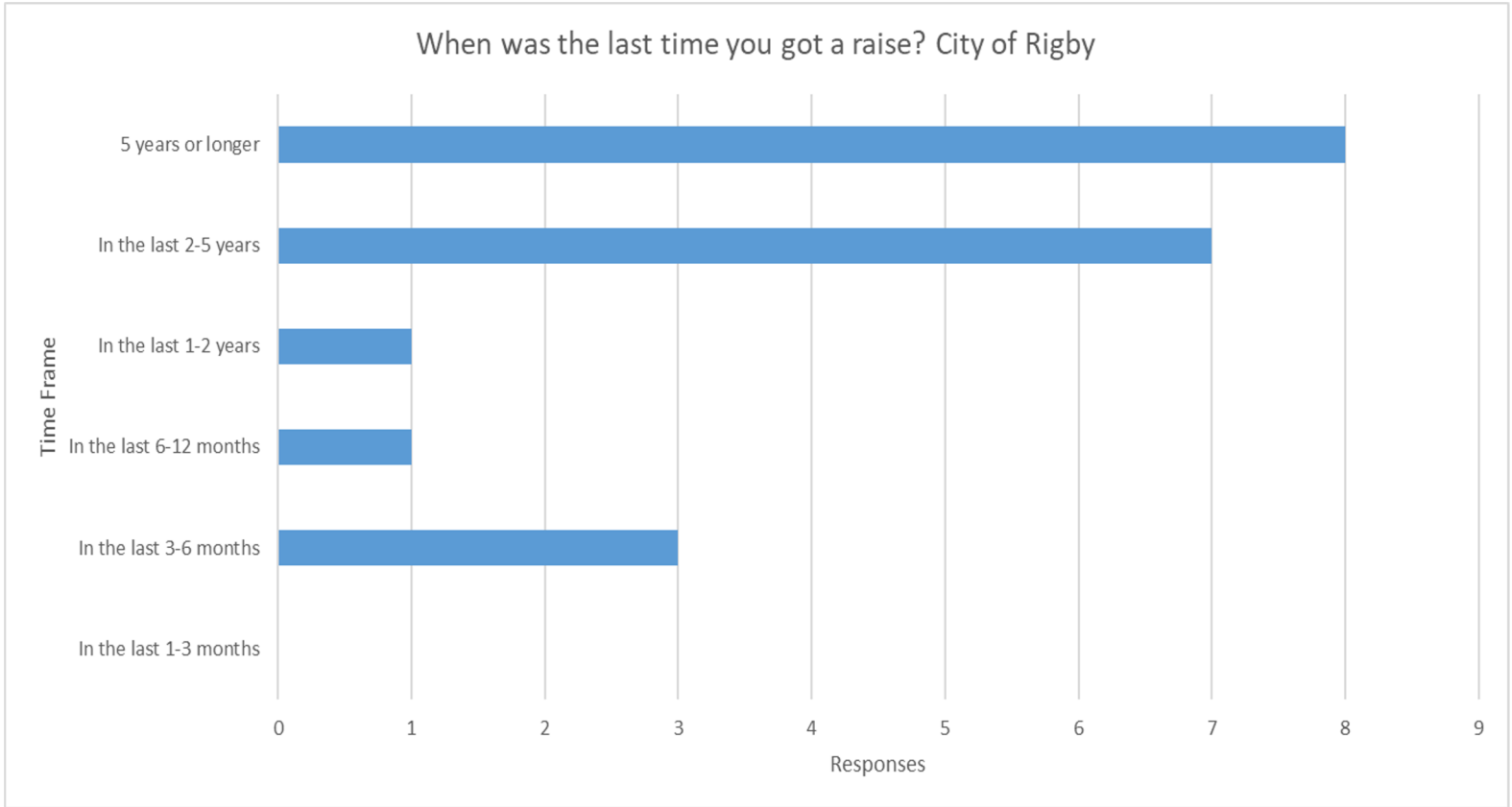


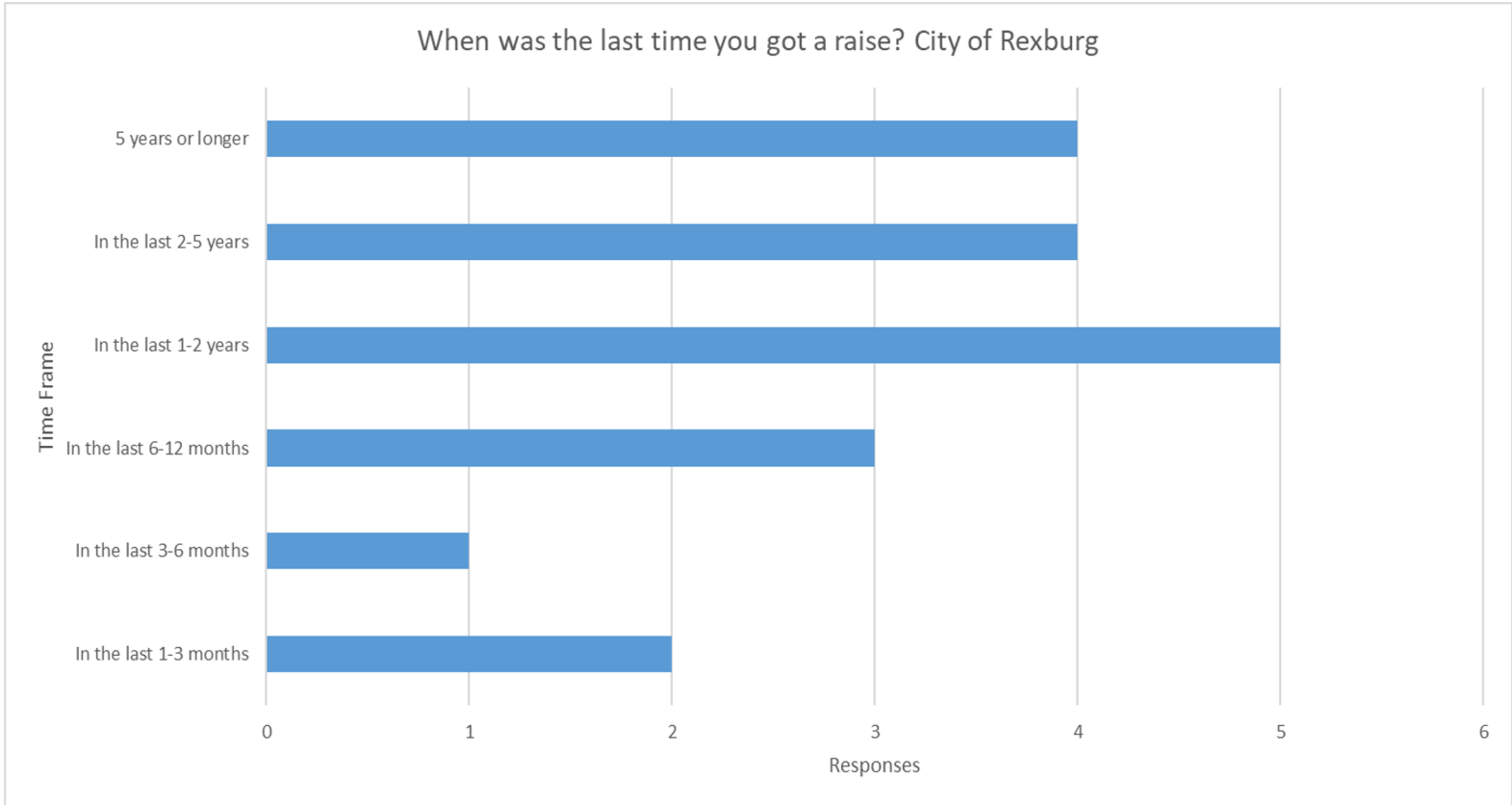


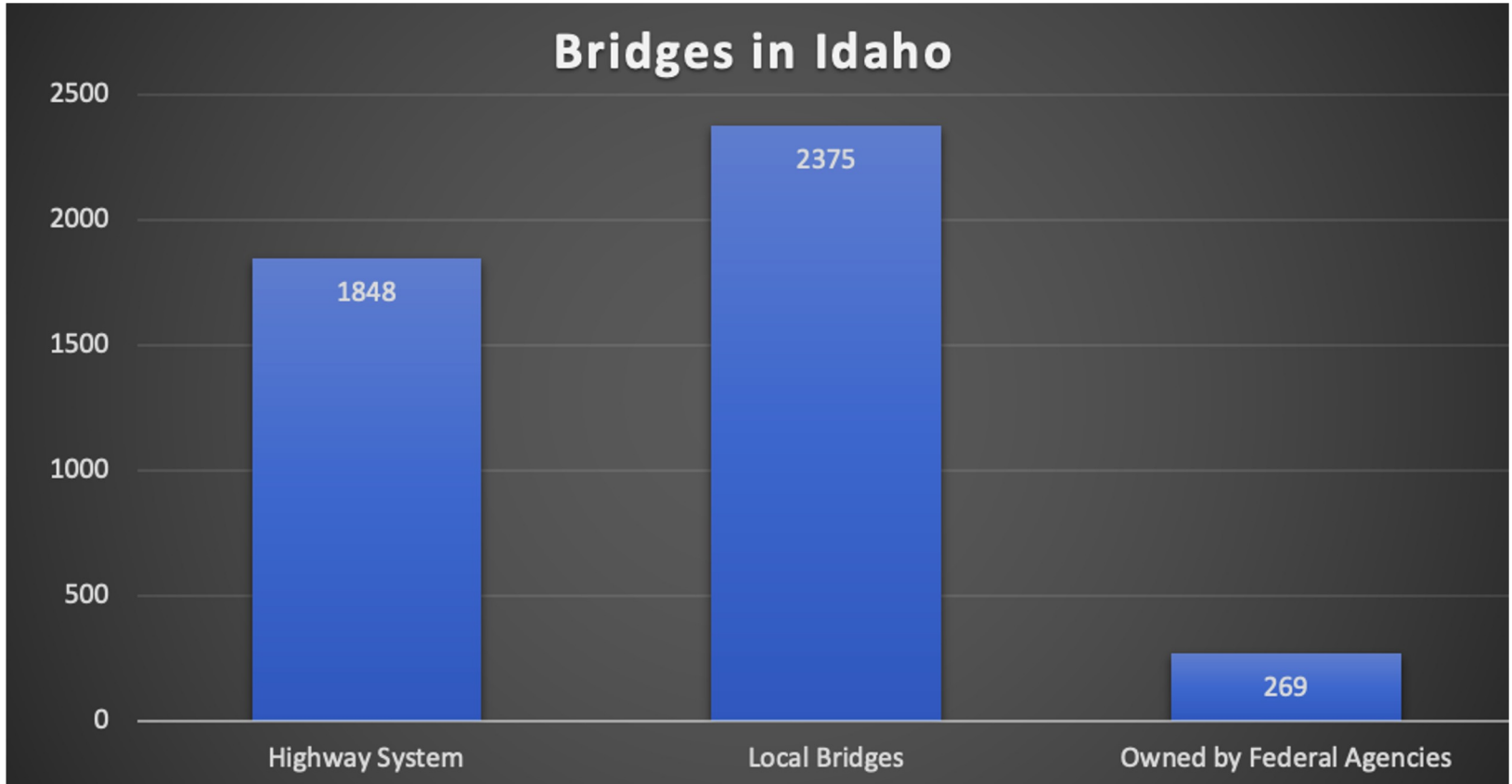




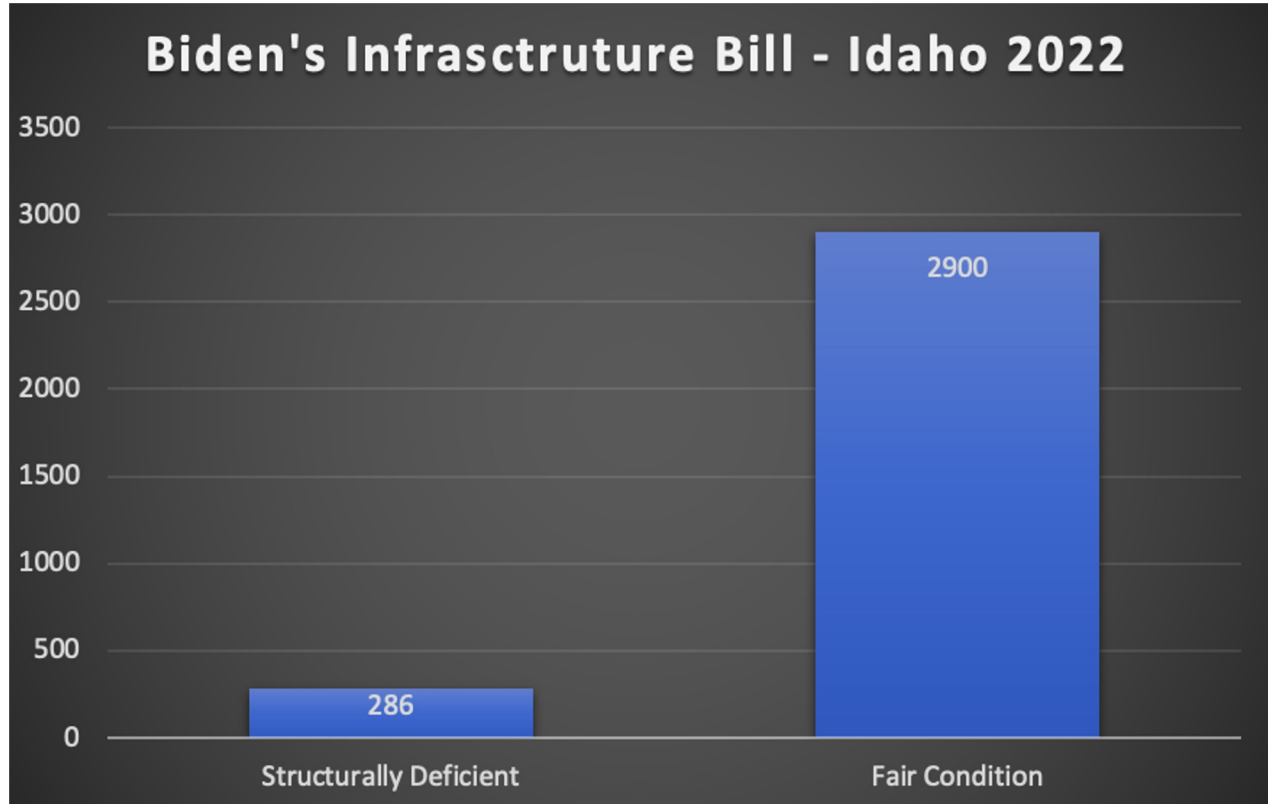


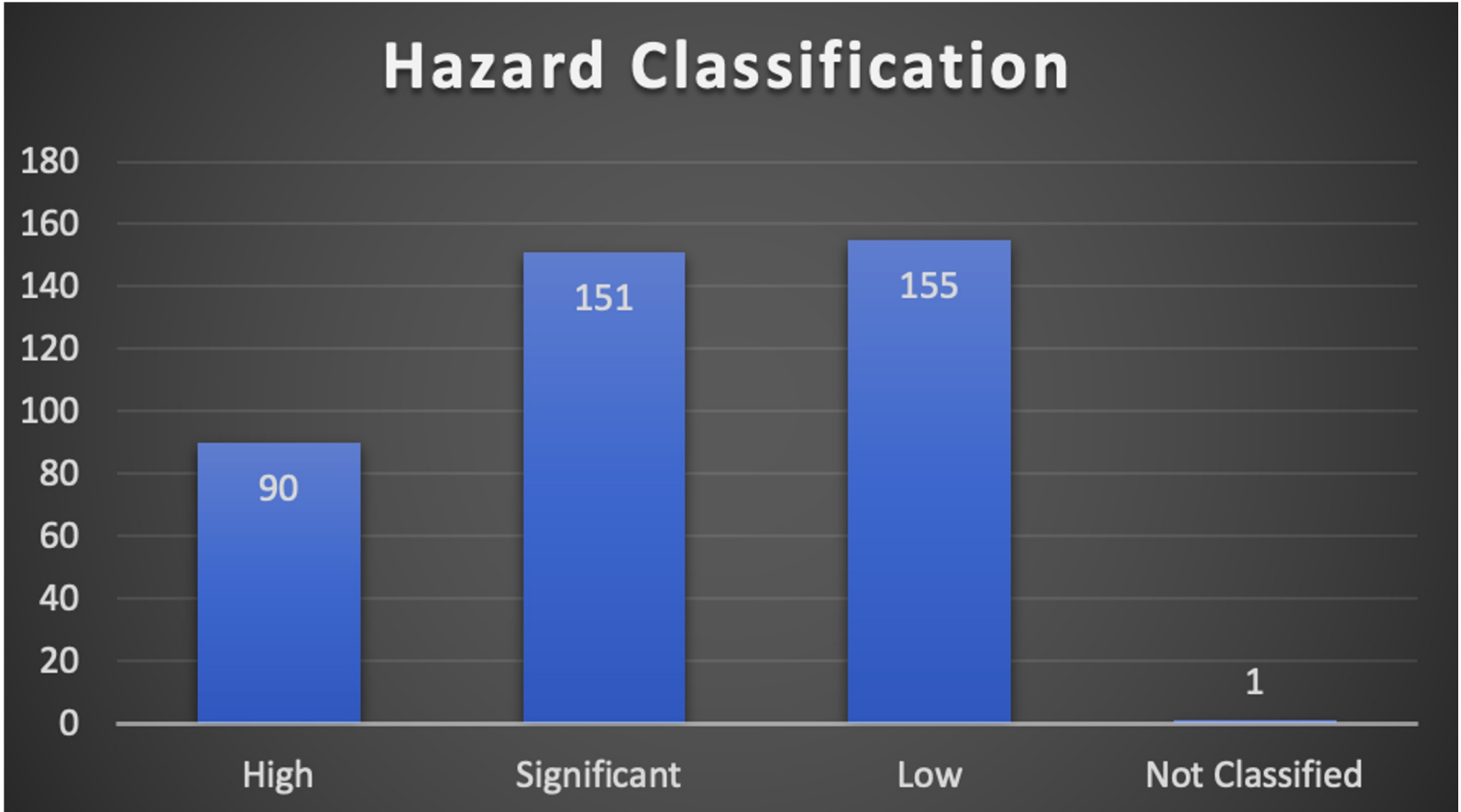


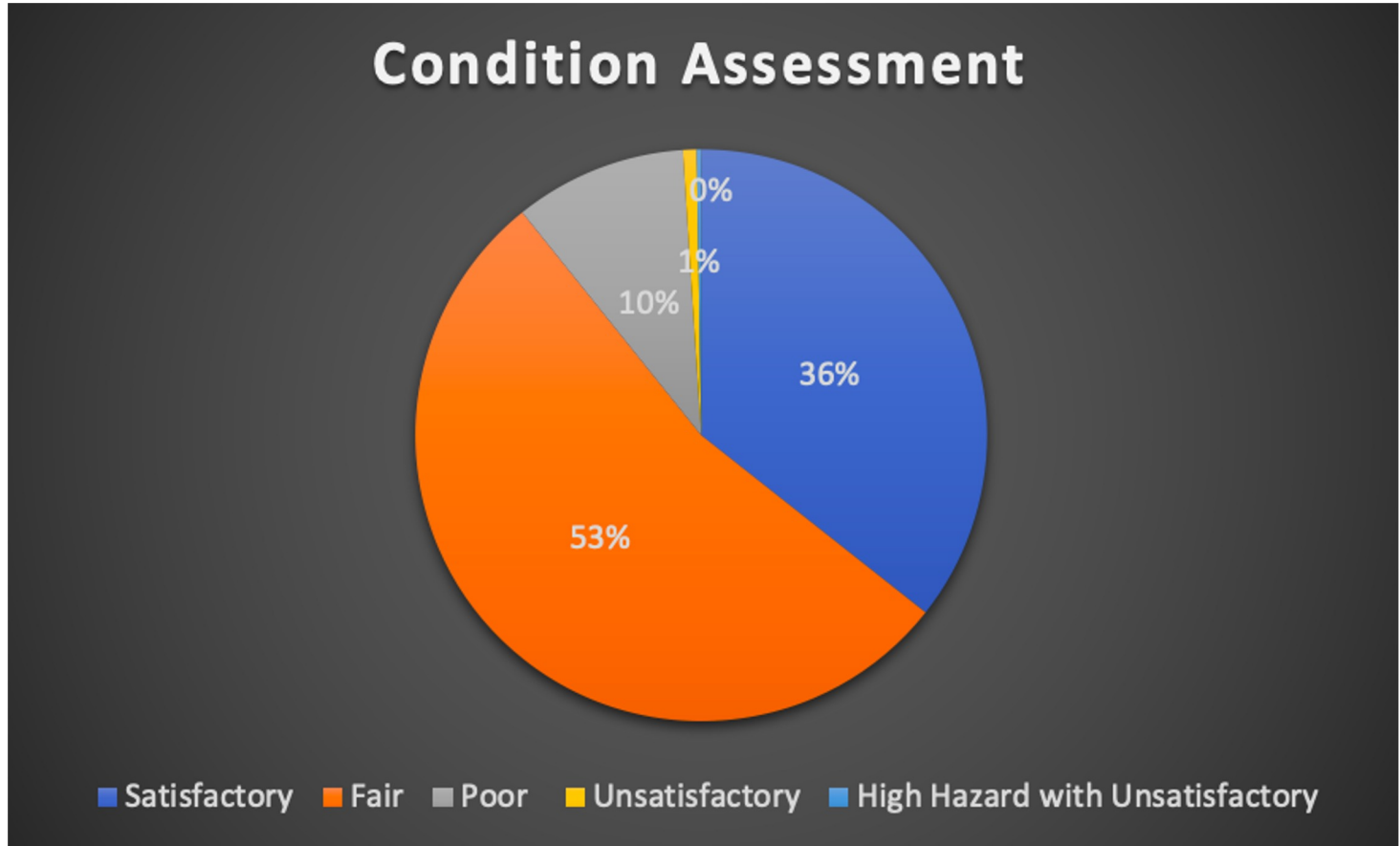




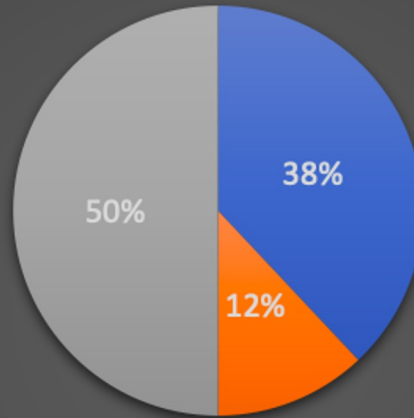
- Idaho received \$225 million this year

- 8.7% of all the bridge stock in Idaho is structurally deficient





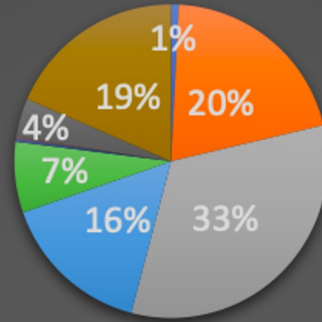


Public Water Systems
